### **What types of gift can I leave?**

There are a number of ways that you can leave a legacy, the main ones being:

*Pecuniary:* this is the most straightforward type of legacy, where a specific amount is given – for example "I leave £500 to WasteAid."

*Specific bequest:* this is where a donor leaves an item that can either be kept or sold by the beneficiary.

*Residuary:* this is where either the whole or a proportion of the residue of an estate is given, after all the pecuniary legacies and specific bequests have been made and all testamentary expenses have been paid.

Your gift, however large or small, will help WasteAid spread skills to more communities so they can manage their waste safely and sustainably.
