## WasteAid UK Report of the Trustees For the year ended 31 December 2019

The Trustees, who are also directors for the purposes of company law, have pleasure in presenting their report and the financial statements for the charitable company for the year ended 31 December 2019. The Trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

#### Chair's report

In 2019, WasteAid continued with another year of steady progress, increased turnover and project impact and organisational development to prepare for sustained expansion.

Waste management, recycling and ocean plastics remained topics of strong public and policy interest and this is reflected in increased demand for our expertise.

Our projects in Kenya and The Gambia continued to develop well, and we commenced a new DfID/UKAid funded project in Cameroon as part of a sustained fundraising effort in 2019 under the UK Aid Match programme which secured funds for a new community recycling centre in Douala. UK Aid Match was an exciting and intense fundraising programme for us, and we would like to record our appreciation to all our individual and corporate supporters who rallied magnificently to support this targeted appeal. This included our latest Walk for WasteAid, which was held in Manchester and involved 45 supporters walking 15 miles from Manchester United's Old Trafford to Manchester City's Etihad Stadium and raising more than £10,000.

Our work with corporate supporters developed well and we are pleased to be able to continue our three-year support programme with Biffa, which has included cash donations, additional fundraising efforts by Biffa teams and help-in-kind with organisation and project support. UpBeat Drinks donated £6,000 for a biodigester in Kenya, and Bunzl has donated £92,000 for a new project in Indonesia to provide vital infrastructure for waste collections, sorting and processing of plastics for recycling. We started negotiations for a significant funding contract with Huhtamaki for a two-year, fully funded programme of support for community circular economy projects and a digital e-learning platform to be launched during 2020 in South Africa, India, and Vietnam.

As the organisation has grown rapidly, we have taken steps to review our organisational structure, capacity, and strategy. This has included recruitment of new Trustees to build capacity and widen our experience base, succession planning for the departure of the former CEO and further development of the staff team with training, recruitment and increased formalising of contracts and conditions of service. This is all part of the evolution of WasteAid from a small charity, as we build the structure, processes and staffing needed for sustained growth and impact.

Looking back on 2019 as a year of consolidation, growth and increased impact we find ourselves into 2020 and the most challenging times for all of us, thanks to the ongoing challenges of the Covid-19 pandemic and the impact on operations, fundraising and future impact. We are fortunate to have the support of many individual donors and supporters, UKAid grant support for projects, trusts and foundations that have assisted our development and a growing number of corporate supporters linked to significant project delivery. We are well placed to withstand the impact of Covid-19, have taken steps to support our projects in-country throughout the pandemic and are confident that the imperative of tackling poor waste management, improving local public health and creating sustained livelihoods will remain a priority for civil society to address as we emerge into an era where a "Green Recovery" is seen as integral to the economic and social renewal that will be needed post-Covid19.

WasteAid thanks all our partners, supporters, and donors for their continued support during 2019 and we look forward to continued support in the years to come.
